Venue

Auditorium of the AGH University of Science and Technology
Reymonta 7, Kraków, Poland (see Maps 1, 3 and 4 below)

Registration and Information Desk

All participants are requested to check in at the registration and information desk. You can register during the welcome reception on Sunday, July 12, 2007 from 3.30 – 6.00 p.m. and on Monday, July 13, 2007 from 8.00 a.m. on. The registration and information desk will be open during the entire Conference.

If you have to pay your conference fee at the registration, please keep in mind, that it may be done by a credit card or in cash in Polish currency (Polish zloty). Other currencies (euro, US dollars, etc) will not be accepted.

Badges/Tickets

All participants and accompanying persons will receive a personal badge upon registration.

Name badges have been color-coded as follows:

White – Participants

Violet – Technical exhibitors

Green – Accompanying persons

Yellow – Conference organizers

Please be so kind to wear your badge during all Conference sessions and social events.

For the reception on Monday July 13, 2009, the excursion and the Conference dinner on Wednesday July 15, 2009, tickets are required. Tickets will be handed out during the registration.

Lunches and coffee breaks

During the Conference the coffee breaks will be held in the Auditorium.

Lunches will be served in the canteen at Reymonta 15 (3 minutes walk from the Auditorium) – see map 1 below. Coffee and lunches are covered by the registration fee for participants and technical exhibitors (lunch tickets will be handed out during the registration).

Internet facilities

In the conference building there is wireless connection to the internet.

Transportation

The Krakow airport Balice lies 11 km of the city. The fastest way to get to the centre is by train. The service connecting the main railway station (Dworzec Główny) with Krakow airport runs approximately every half hour from 4 am. until midnight. Tickets are available on board for 8 PLN. The platform is approximately 200 meters from the passenger terminal and you can reach it with a free shuttle bus standing in front of the terminal. Travel time from the airport to the main railway station is approximately 15 minutes. Alternatively you can take one of taxis, which are waiting in front of the main terminal, but the travel will be longer than by train. The price for travel to the centre should cost about 50-70 PLN. Timetable of the train you can find at <http://www.krakowairport.pl/en/3/176/35/pl>. The cheapest and the longest way to reach the city is by bus line No. 292 (ticket 3 PLN).

Within the city you can use public transport (MPK), which is based on trams and buses. Tickets can be purchased in kiosks and, with a surcharge (0.50 PLN), from the driver. On some stops and in some trams there are also automatic ticket machines.

A single-trip ticket (allows one way trip, without interchange) costs 2.5 PLN. There are also one-hour tickets for 3.1 PLN. The tickets should be validated in a ticket puncher immediately after boarding a vehicle.

There are several bus stops near the conference venue (see Map 4 below). If you live in the hotel Etap or DS16 (which are about 20-25 min walk from the conference venue), you can take from the bus-stop "Armii Krajowej" the following buses 103, 139, 173, 208, 228 and you should get out at the third stop ("Czarnowiejska"). If you live in the hotel Ibis (a shorter walk), you can take buses 103 or 173 from the stop "Jubilat" and get out at the second stop ("Czarnowiejska"). The hotels located in the old centre are in the walking distance and there is no direct bus or tram connection to the conference venue.

Scientific Information

Submission of manuscripts

Manuscripts presented at the Conference can only be submitted for publication in the Proceedings i.e. a special issue of Radiation Measurements on-line by the (first) author himself. Via the Elsevier Editorial System (EES) website for this journal at <http://ees.elsevier.com/radmeas> you will be guided stepwise through the creation and uploading of the various files. After entering your title you will be asked to 'Select Article Type' with a pop-up menu from which you select: "LUMDETR 2009" Manuscripts will be accepted until one month after the end of the Conference (August 17, 2009).

Only one submission per a registered participant is allowed.

Poster Presentations

- Poster area

The poster sessions will take place in the building in which also the canteen is located (Reymonta 15), which is just 3 minutes walk from the Auditorium (see Map 1 below).

- Poster mounting

There will be two Poster Sessions:

For the Session-1 poster presenters should mount their poster on Sunday July 12, 2009 between 3.30 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. or on Monday July 13 between 8.00 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. You should remove your poster right after the end of the poster session on Tuesday.

For the Session-2 poster presenters should mount their poster on Wednesday July 15, 2009 between 8.00 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

You will find the number of your poster on the panel. You will be provided with materials to attach your poster to the panel.

- **Poster viewing and presentation**

During the session at least one of the co-authors must be present at the poster. If no presenter shows up, the paper will not be published in the Proceedings.

Oral Presentations

- **Oral sessions**

The oral sessions will be held in the Auditorium, Reymonta 7.

- **Instructions to speakers**

Each speaker should bring the final version of the presentation (in Power Point 2003 or pdf format) on a USB stick or burnt on a CD. You should check-in at the Computer Room (at the 2nd floor) the day before your presentation (on Sunday check-in will be available during registration) or before the start of the morning session on the day of your presentations latest. Personnel will be there to assist you in transferring the files from the CD/USB stick to the system computer. Presentation from a private laptop is not possible.

Prior to the start of the session, please identify yourself to the session chairs and familiarize yourself with the presentation tools. The time allocated for each oral presentation includes about 3 minutes of discussion time. Chairpersons will be requested to adhere to the times, so please do not risk running out of time and therefore missing the opportunity for questions and discussion.

Social program

Welcome drink on Sunday July 12, 2009

Welcome drink will be offered at the Auditorium (Reymonta 7) from 3.30 p.m.– 6.00 p.m. During this reception it will be possible to register at the registration desk. The welcome drink is included in the participant and accompanying person's fee.

Reception at the City Hall on Monday July 13, 2009

The reception offered by the Mayor of the City of Kraków starts at 8.00 p.m. and lasts until 10.00 p.m. The City Hall is located in the Old City Centre, which is in a walking distance from the conference venue (see Map 3 below). This reception is included in the participants and accompanying person's fee. Transportation to the City Hall will NOT be arranged, but after the reception there will be buses available, which will drive to the hotels located outside the center.

City tour on Wednesday July 15, 2009

The tour will start at 2:30 p.m. and it will last 2 hours. Transfers are included - from the conference venue to the Old Town and after city sightseeing back to the hotels.

Our visit to Old Town will include a walk across the Main Square, the Church of the Virgin Mary (Kościół Mariacki), which boasts one of the greatest Gothic altars in Europe, carved in wood by the great Veit Stoss (Wit Stwosz).

Afterwards, we will continue along the Royal Way from the Barbican (city gates) and the St. Florian's Gate to the Wawel Hill. The Wawel Hill, called the "Polish Acropolis" by Poles, is the site of the Royal Wawel Castle, which was a royal residence since the 11th century. The arcade courtyard represents the architecture of the so called "golden age of Polish culture".

Krakow is the city of one of the oldest European universities, the Jagiellonian University, founded in 1364. Among the most prominent students of this university were Nicolaus Copernicus, whose heliocentric theory of the universe revolutionized our vision of the world, and Karol Wojtyła, later elected to become Pope John Paul II. The oldest preserved building of the university is Collegium Maius, dating back to the 15th century. Now welcoming visitors as a university museum, it offers numerous Copernicus memorabilia, old Arabian astronomical instruments and the oldest globe with the map of America from the beginning of the 16th century.

Our visit will include entrances to the Church of the Virgin Mary and Collegium Maius.

The price of the excursion is included in the participants and accompanying person's fee.

Conference dinner on Wednesday July 15, 2009

The Conference dinner will be held in a unique place: in the Gothic cloisters of the Franciscan Monastery, dating from the first half of the 15th century. The cloisters surround a rectangular viridary and are adjacent to the church of St. Francis of Assisi, dating from the middle of 13th century. The monastery is uninterrupted, since that time till now, inhabited by the Franciscan friars, who kindly allowed us to have our event there.

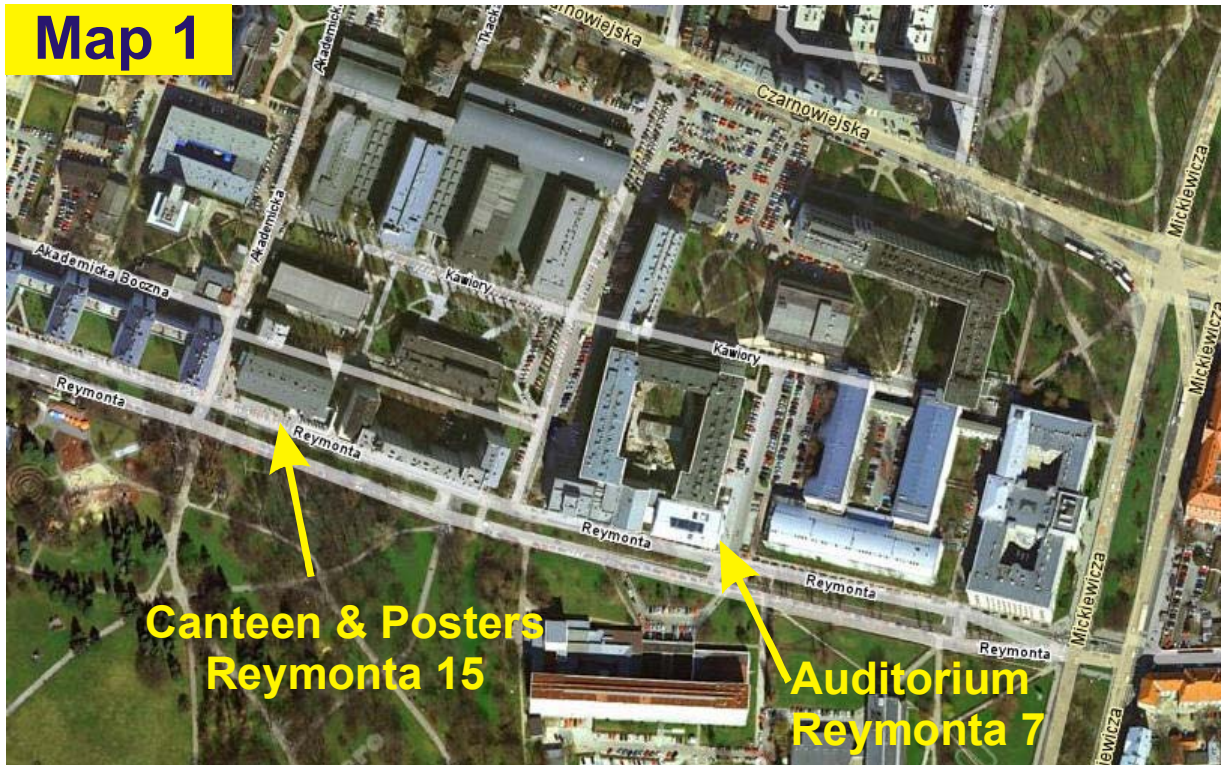
The dinner starts at 8:00 p.m.

Transportation to the dinner will NOT be arranged, but after the dinner there will be buses available, which will drive to the hotels located outside the center.

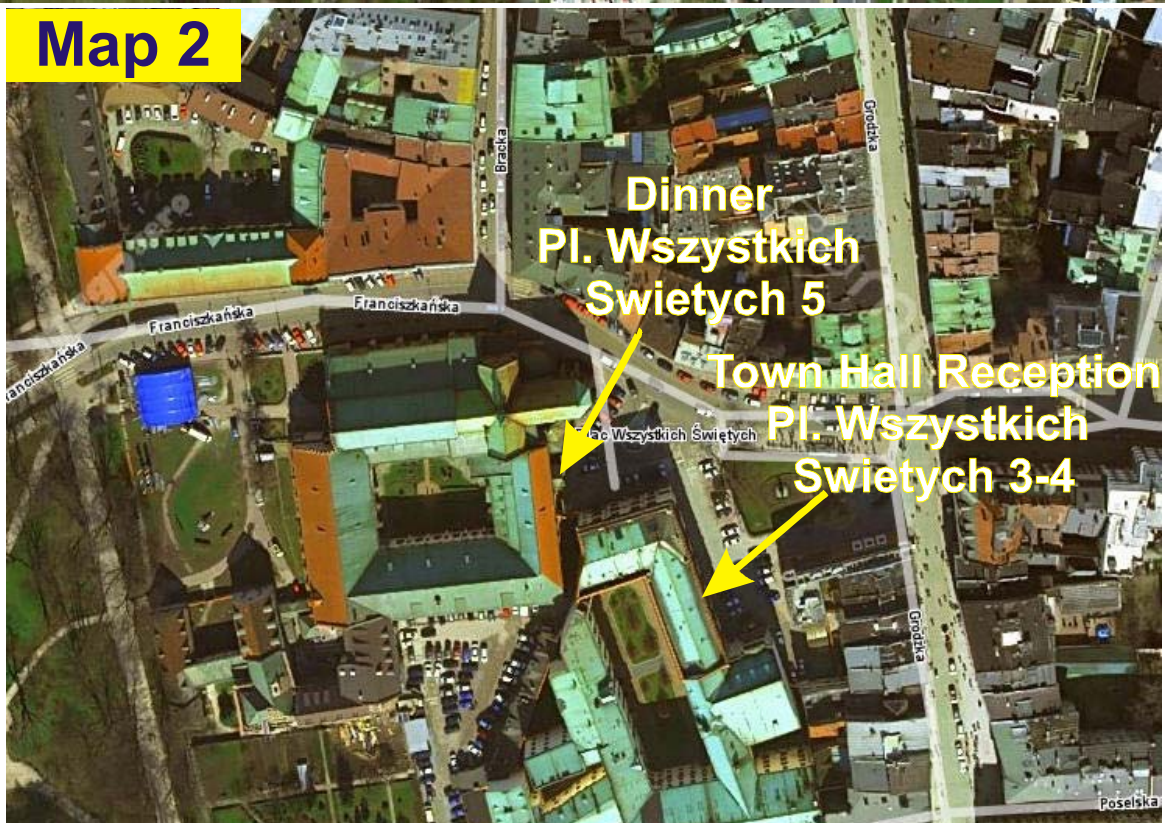
The price of the dinner is included in the participants and accompanying person's fee.

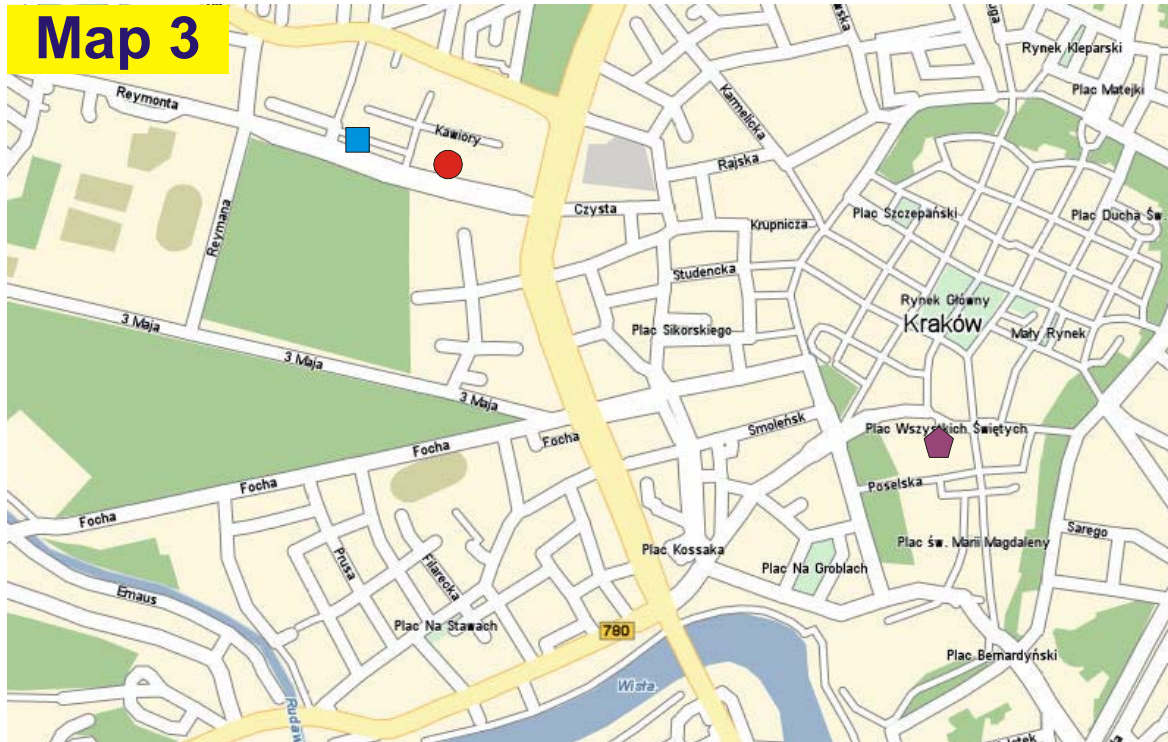
